For this purpose, NDCC 2011 will explore the dialectic relation between discourse and social change in various domains of social life in China.

The first colloquium and workshop were jointly organised by Nankai University and Tianjin University of Commerce in April 2006, the second by Lancaster University (IAS, LCMC, and LEAL) in September 2007, and the third by Tianjin University of Commerce and Nankai University in May 2009. The fourth NDCC conference is to be held by the Faculty of English Language and Culture, Guangdong University of Foreign Studies in November 2011.
